Keeping Milk Cold in Hot Weather



To ensure the best flavor for your milk and preserve its shelf life, we encourage you to keep it cold on your drive home.

Here are a few hints for keeping milk at its best during all seasons:

- put your milk in a cooler
- put ice packs around your milk
- purchase some ice from the Dairy Store
- purchase insulated bags from the Dairy Store
- keep your milk out of sunlight
- Keep your milk in the body of your fridge, rather than the door

Why We Use Glass Bottles



We are so proud to offer our farm fresh milk in glass bottles! Aside from the nostalgia, there are several reasons why buying milk in glass bottles is a sustainable choice.

Milk in glass bottles stays colder than other forms of packaging, so it can have a longer shelf life. When milk is stored in plastic, carcinogens can leach into the liquid and affect product quality and taste. So, milk in glass bottles tastes better.

Why do we have a \$2 deposit per bottle? Simply put, we want you to return your bottles! Glass bottles can be reused many times over. The photo above shows one of our oldest milk bottles. It is from 1978! It has been reused for 42 years so far and is still going strong.

Sure, you could recycle glass but that uses up precious resources. We believe reusing glass is a much better choice than recycling it. Plastic and other forms of milk packaging are often discarded into landfills. According to a study, 91% of plastic is not recycled. Reusing glass bottles is a very eco-friendly choice.

Here's a quick calculation to estimate how much waste can be eliminated by using glass bottles. Our executive director estimates that the average person buys milk once every 2 weeks or 26 times a year. Over one year of using glass bottles, 26 containers are saved from landfills! Wow! Our oldest glass bottle is 42 years old. We can estimate that this **single** bottle has kept over 1,000 single-use milk containers out of landfills. ($26 \times 42 = 1,092$). When you choose to reuse glass bottles, you are making a profound difference in the health of our planet. That sounds like a winning strategy to us!

When you have finished your milk. Please rinse out the bottle and return it to the Dairy Store. Our friendly cashiers will refund you \$2 per bottle returned. All of these bottles are thoroughly cleaned in the production area of our Dairy Store. And finally, they are refilled by hand, not by robots. We hope you will continue purchasing our milk products and reusing glass bottles. Together we can make a powerful impact on our planet.

New Water Bottle Filling Stations

You may have noticed that we stopped selling plastic water bottles several months ago to reduce plastic consumption. We are so excited to announce that we recently installed 2 new touch-less water bottle filling stations in our Dairy Store. It's an easy way to fill your reusable bottle with cold, pure and delicious water. Each fountain has a ticker which keeps tracks of how many bottles have been filled and thus saved from a landfill.

When you come to the farm, please bring along a reusable water bottle and fill it up at our new filling station! Together, we can reduce the amount of plastic consumption in our community.

Yellow Butter and Eggs



Summer is a delightful time of year around the farm. Our animals love being out in pasture so much. Have you noticed that in the summer time our butter and egg yolks become more yellow than usual?

Our cows are out on pasture in the summer between their milkings. They graze on fresh green grass almost all day long. The grass contains a variety of nutrients, but most notably the increase of beta-carotene in their diet makes our cows' butter turn more yellow than usual.

Our chickens move to summer pastures in warmer weather. They scratch and peck throughout the day and forage for bugs, tasty critters, and grasses. Roaming for their favorite foods adds a lot of nutritional value to their diet and you guessed it...it makes their egg

yolks a much richer color too.

Alpaca Vacation



During the coronavirus stay-at-home orders, we missed having visitors to our farm. We suspect our animals missed their regular visitors too! We wanted to share one positive impact that the shutdown had on our farm.

A lot of farm friends contacted us because they noticed as they drove by that our alpaca was not in her regular spot. Since we were not having visitors, we decided to temporarily move our alpaca and her friends from the main paddock by the stream.
